12/11 - "Times Remembered at the Carolina Theatre"



Durham Rotary Member Connie Campanaro spoke about the history of the Carolina Theatre, and introduced Geoff Weiss, assistant professor for communications, University of Charleston, who produced the documentary about the theater's 80 year history.

The theatre was originally the Durham Auditorium, and 50 years later in 1972 was downtown's sole remaining theatre.

The passage of a \$7.8 million bond package in 1986 helped restore the facility, and 7 1/2 Elizabeth Branigan, Connie Campanaro, Geoff Weiss years later in 1994 the theatre reopened to the general public.

During the showing of the documentary, club members heard the story of the Carolina Theatre through the testimonials of Sinclair Williams, Monte Moses, Sylvia Kerckhoff, and our own Howard Clement.

65% of theatre visits are from out-of-town guests, and new bond dollars will help pay for much needed roof, HVAC, and dimmer system repairs.

The program will begin with piano selections from accomplished pianist Christopher Camitta, a third grader from Little River Elementary School. One of his compositions recently won a regional competition. The program will then feature select singers from Little River's chorus under the direction of Jenny Hobgood and Northern High School's auditioned show choir "Knight Sounds," under the direction of Amy Daw.

This fall Northern High School represented North Carolina at the "National Anthem Project" celebration in New York City and experienced singing at Ground Zero. This spring Northern choral students will participate in a choir competition in Florida while Little River's chorus will travel to Washington, D.C. to participate in the "America Sings Music Festival."

Special note: There is a close relationship between these two schools because Little River is feeder school to Northern plus Mrs. Hobgood was a member of "Knight Sounds" when she attended Northern with Mrs. Daw as her choral teacher!
