"RDU AIRPORT - NOW AND THE FUTURE"

John C. Brantley, Airport Director

Raleigh native and NC State alumnus, John Brantley presented an interesting look at the past and future of RDU Airport to Rotarians on July 17. As RDU's Director, Brantley oversees the operation of this ever-growing facility. Monday he shared photos and statistics that illustrated the airport's dramatic growth since it was built in the 1940s.



That growth accelerated after Congress de-regulated the airline industry in 1978, Brantley explained, but has been spurred on in more recent years by the corresponding growth of the Triangle. Today, RDU is the 36th largest airport in the country, taking into consideration those travelers who begin or end their journey there. RDU serves more travelers than Charlotte and boasts the only non-stop flight to London Gatwick that does not originate from a HUB or major metro airport. Today RDU averages 218 daily flights on nine airlines — JetBlue joined the ranks on July 20. Operating revenue for the airport totals nearly \$75 million, while expenses come in at \$33.2 million. The net revenue — \$45.1 million — gets plowed back into airport improvements, said Brantley.

Currently, the airport is rebuilding Terminal C — formerly the American Airlines terminal — slated for completion in 2010. The innovative, light-filled design was completed by three architects who also graduated from NC State.

Brantley concluded with an explanation: Major airports are always under construction, constantly striving to keep pace with the area's needs and serve the local population. . . . *Shelly Weitz*
